Today I wanted to share what has been declared the most powerful sentence a parent can say. I appreciate that this is quite a claim. As parents, we are always conscious and mindful of doing the best we can for our children. As teachers, we share the same goal. I am always a little sceptical of such claims as this but there is some valid thinking and research behind it. Let me share the sentence and some of the thinking behind it.

These powerful words are "I'm so proud of you". These words are especially powerful because they achieve four outcomes.

- Firstly, they reduce the fear of failure. This phrase indicates to the child that they have your support. This will encourage risk-taking and experimentation both key elements of academic, social, and personal development.
- 2. Secondly, they increase self-esteem. Such displays of warmth from parents can increase children's self-esteem. High self-esteem is essential to young people so that they grow up feeling valued and likely to believe that others will accept them for who they are. Such expressions also prevent a focus on the talents of a child in comparison to others. Comparison to others (eg "you were so much better than X") can lead to negative outcomes such as narcissism

- 3. Thirdly, this sentence prevents the development of a 'fixed mindset.' Praising process over achievement leads to children valuing effort or how something has been achieved. This leads to a growth mindset. This is beneficial to learning and overall development.
- 4. Lastly, this is what children want to hear. They are not looking for their parents to comment on technical or tactical advice. Rather they want words of encouragement and advice on effort attitude or practical aspects.

Saying "I'm proud of you" is so simple, yet research has proved this type of sentence to have very powerful effects. When children hear this phrase from their parents they are less likely to fear failure and instead feel encouraged to learn and try new techniques. They also experience an increased sense of self-worth, which leads to improvements in wellbeing and social relationships. With such outcomes being realised, we hope that this single sentence will allow our children to feel liberated to live and explore life in the ways in which they are meant to.


The two sessions were filled with intense, thought provoking debates where the young participants displayed their keen awareness on global and national issues.




