




Each university was given 10 minutes to discuss with one batch of students, where they explained about the university admission process, course details, fee structures etc..

Survey on Students Preferences

To set the pace for the Career Fair, a survey was conducted among the Grades 11&12 students to understand the students' preferences on their destination and university choices. This survey provided a broader perspective on students' expectation from the participating universities in the Career Fair.

Survey results:

From the survey, we found that 60% of the students prefer to study in India, 15% choose to complete their under graduation in the United Kingdom and 15% in the United Arab Emirates. 10% have also shown their preference for Canada, United States, Australia and Germany.

Based on this survey, the universities were selected and invited to participate in the GMS Career Fair 2020, virtually.

For Grades 9 to 12, Career Guidance sessions at GMS is an on-going process, as every working day from 3.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m., individual career guidance sessions are conducted for the Senior School students (Grades 11 and 12) to support them in their career options, admission processes and the Mindler Career Assessment discussion.

Choosing the right subjects and their relevant career options are explained via webinars and workshops to Grades 9 and 10.

6 WAYS TO HELP YOUR CHILD BECOME A GOOD DECISION MAKER

How often have you made a decision for your child or even compelled your child into making a decision you would prefer them to make?

OR

Influenced their decision because you know it is a bad decision and you do not want them to have to face the consequences of that said decision?

Children often make bad decisions because of lack of experience and perspective. Many decisions are made by children on an impulse, because of peer pressure, because they are bored or wanting to get back at their parents. They do not consider the consequences and some of these decisions may have a long time effect on their lives. Children can be rash, egocentric and short-sighted.

How can we raise good decision makers?

1. Children must be allowed to make choices

Children don't always realize that they have choices. They don't look at the different options available to them. Make the time to offer your child choices and create situations for choice in their day. Have patience, allow them to make the choices and reinforce the importance of making these choices.

2. Children must experience the consequences of their choices

It is imperative that they learn to consider the risks and rewards of their decisions.

3. Children must be taught to follow their conscience

By asking the question: "Why do I want to do this?" they start understanding what motivates their decisions.

4. Limit choices and discuss options

By doing this you are lessening opportunities for conflict and creating a situation where your child will succeed in making a good choice. Take the time to discuss why one choice is better than another so that they can learn to make decisions for themselves

5. Take others into account

This is especially relevant when taking turns. Discuss why one takes turns by placing the emphasis on how the other person will feel if they don't get a chance.

6. Reflect on past choices and use them as an example

Discuss how they could have made a different choice and what the outcome of that choice may have been.

It is natural for children to place themselves first when making choices or decisions, especially when younger. Help them to understand how to make a decision that is beneficial to both, themselves and others.
