Student leadership at GMS truly reflects the quality of students we have in our wonderful school. The students who have been invested have gone through interviews and a very rigorous selection process. It is most important that we get the selection of our student leaders right, for they have an active role in decision-making across the school. It is they who decide the school climate, the improvement projects and make our school a place where students want to be, where every child feels safe, happy and like they belong.

Students, congratulations to you on being inducted into these very important leadership positions. You each have been recognised for your personal leadership characteristics. Great leaders don't set out to be just leaders.... they set out to make a difference. It's never about the role – it's always about the goal. Leadership is about the decisions you make and the actions that you take each day. A badge is not to be worn with arrogance but with humility. Good leaders use power to empower the powerless.

A big part of leadership has a lot to do with communication. There is enough evidence to suggest that communication follows the 55, 38, 7 Mehrabian rule. 55% of what you communicate is through your actions, your facial expressions, what you are wearing and how you are wearing it (simply translated, your uniform - how smartly you are turned out and how you are groomed), your gestures, your posture – how you carry yourself! 38% is in the tone, pitch, the speed and the rhythm of your voice. An incredible 93% of what you communicate is non-verbal. What you actually say – the words that you speak - makes up only 7% of all communication.

This year you have a great opportunity to forge your own style of leadership, and to change the status quo!

Have a clear understanding of your role; work with passion; and have the ability to make others feel charged and energized.


Keep lines of communication open so those you are in charge of feel free to share concerns and ideas.

CYBER BULLYING

What is cyber bullying?
Cyberbullying is the use of electronic communication to bully a person.

How does it affect a person?
The effects can be long-term and affect a person in many ways:
Mentally - Feeling upset, embarrassed, stupid, even angry.
Emotionally - Feeling ashamed, losing interest in the things you love.Physically - tired, loss of sleep, experiencing symptoms like stomach aches and headaches.

What should you do if you're being cyberbullied?
You think you're being bullied, just stop it or seek help.

From someone you trust if the bullying is occurring on a social platform, consider blocking the bully and formally reporting their behaviour on the platform itself. For bullying to stop, it needs to be identified and reporting it is key. It can also help to show the bully that their behaviour is unacceptable. How can you avoid being a cyberbully? You should treat people with respect, and treat people the way you want to be treated. If you act respectfully, you can avoid being a bully. For example, if a friend sends a mean message to you, sending back a mean message to them will not be considered as respect. Instead, ignore it and show it to a trusted adult.



CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

Children's rights are a subset of human rights with particular attention to the rights of special protection and care afforded to minors.

The 1989 Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) defines a child as "any human being below the age of eighteen years, unless under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier."

TIPS FOR PARENTS

BY OUR SCHOOL COUNSELLOR - MS. SHERIN JAYAKUMAR

We all have been sheltering in our homes for a long time now. At GMS, we are mindful to keep our children safe online, as they take to their laptops and iPads to stay connected, learn and entertain themselves. They are in an increased risk of online harassment, sexual abuse and exploitations.

The COVID pandemic has created a perfect storm for online predators to lure children who are lonely, confused and maybe looking for validation.

Here are a few easy tips to keep them safe:

1. **Open Communication:**

Let us start by saying this, the most important safety measure is to have an open communication with your children at home. Talk to them about what is going on in their lives online and who they are engaging with, work with your children to establish rules on how long they can be online and encourage daily activities that do not require screens. Get them up and moving!

2. **Use Protective Tools:**

Check that your child's device is running the latest software, antivirus programs and that privacy settings are in place. Keep the Webcams covered when not in use! For younger children, set up parental controls and use tools like SAFE SEARCH on Google.

3. **Watch what they share:**

Help children to learn to keep personal information private, especially from strangers. Children should never provide a photo or their full name to use learning resources online.

4. **Look out for warning signs:**

Watch out for signs of distress in the child such as becoming withdrawn, upset, secretive or depressed. It might be connected with their increased online activity.

5. **Report Cyber Bullying:**

Be familiar with the School Safeguarding and Bullying policies, also have the contact numbers of support helplines and hotlines handy to report cyber bullying or inappropriate content.
